MEMORANDUM OF INFORMATION

Royal Perth Hospital is a fully accredited major teaching hospital of nearly 1000 beds associated with the University of Western Australia. The Haematology Department is housed in modern, spacious facilities and its laboratories provide a comprehensive diagnostic service to the hospital. In addition, it is responsible for the care of all patients with haematological disorders.

Royal Perth Hospital is the State centre for adult allogeneic bone marrow transplantation, haemophilia care and apheresis and has a major commitment to the management of haematological disorders, both malignant and non-malignant.

The applicant will need to have basic medical qualifications registrable in Western Australia, FRACP/FRCPA (Haem) and clinical experience relevant to the Duties and Responsibilities.

Duties and Responsibilities

These will include:

1. Management of inpatients with haematological disorders, both malignant and non malignant. The post does not include the routine inpatient management of bone marrow transplant as this is provided by a specific transplant team.
2. Management of outpatients with haematological disorders, including patients with disorders of haemostasis and thrombosis with direct supervision of 2 haemostasis service clinics weekly and a general haematology clinic. Responsibilities include the provision of Telehealth outreach services to one rural centre.
3. Participation in the on call rosters for clinical and laboratory services which will include management of transplant patients afterhours, with additional support from the transplant team when needed.
4. Participation in the provision of laboratory services
5. Undertake postgraduate and undergraduate teaching activities as directed and to show a commitment to continuing education, quality assurance and research.

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
