The Canterbury District Health Board and the University of Otago invite applications to fill a joint clinical Senior Lecturer position specialising in Haematology within the Department of Pathology in the University of Otago, Christchurch and Canterbury District Health Board for the period of up to one year. This position involves both service commitments as a Clinical Haematologist and convenor of the undergraduate medical student haematology programme.

Even though our ideal applicant would want to be taking on this combined academic and clinical role, we would also be interested in hearing from Haematologists who have an interest in a purely clinical role.

Applicants must be able to practice within Canterbury Health Laboratories, the largest and most diverse tertiary pathology laboratory in New Zealand (www.cdhb.govt.nz/chlabs) and within the Clinical Haematology Unit based at Christchurch Hospital.

The appointee will be expected to provide diagnostic consultative service for Canterbury Health Laboratories, to perform outpatient and inpatient clinical haematology duties for the Clinical Haematology Unit, and to supervise haematology registrars. The Clinical Haematology Unit, based at Christchurch Hospital, performs haemopoietic stem cell transplants for the whole of the South Island, sees non-transplant referrals from the upper two-thirds of the South Island, and has an active haemostasis unit.

The University Department of Pathology has a major teaching role in the undergraduate medical course, strong postgraduate programmes and several very active research groups. Applications are welcome from appointees with a proven potential for top quality research and there will be opportunities for research depending on the appointee's interest area. Applicants should enjoy and excel in teaching undergraduates and the oversight of undergraduate and postgraduate programmes within Haematology. Experience in problem-based, self-directed learning methods would be an advantage. The appointee will be expected to foster co-operation between the University, other centres of tertiary education, Canterbury District Health Board and the community.
