

**Joint stem cell transplantation Research Fellowships in the Department of Immunology, Queensland Institute of Medical Research and Department of Haematology, Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital, Brisbane, Queensland, Australia**

The Department of Immunology, QIMR and Haematology, RBWH is inviting applicants for Clinical Research Fellowships for late 2011 and/or early 2012. The Fellows will be selected based on a demonstrated commitment to a career in academic transplant haematology. The positions will be for 3 years and is intended for advanced trainee haematologists wishing to pursue a higher degree in transplantation whilst continuing to gain clinical experience in a very large allograft unit. Salary will be at the level commensurate with qualifications and planned study and will facilitate clinical practise within transplantation. The position will involve joint training in preclinical studies and translational clinical trials within a large group of transplant immunologists and haematologists. Presentation at national and international meetings as well as substantial contribution to publication of results and correlative analysis will be facilitated and expected. The Fellow will work closely with Prof Geoff Hill and A/Prof Glen Kennedy. Prof Hill is a transplant haematologist and heads Immunology at QIMR. His research is funded by a NHMRC Australia Fellowship and NHMRC program grants. The RBWH BMT Unit is the largest in Australia, providing allograft services for over 5 million and undertakes approximately 120 transplants per annum. The combined QIMR/RBWH campus is actively promoting physician/scientist interactions and training. The transplant program is recognized internationally and has strong collaborative links with major units in the USA.
