The team at the Cutaneous Lymphoma Clinic at Westmead Hospital are pleased to invite you to a National Cutaneous Lymphoma Symposium to be held on Friday 23rd August 2019.

The National Cutaneous Lymphoma network was established in 2011 under the leadership of Professor Miles Prince, haematologist and Associate Professor Chris McCormack, dermatologist, from St Vincent's Hospital and the Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre in Melbourne. This network has inspired the development of other multidisciplinary clinics in other states and has improved the understanding and care of patients with cutaneous lymphoma, not only in Australia but around the world.

Two previous symposiums have been held in Melbourne in 2012 and 2015. The aim of the symposium is to update participants on multiple aspects of cutaneous lymphoma from diagnosis to treatments, from the common skin lymphomas to the rarer skin lymphomas, as well as future directions. Management of these rare but important malignancies, is very much multidisciplinary and there will be presentations from both local and interstate haematologists, dermatologists, radiation oncologists, pathologists and clinical nurse consultants. Emphasis will be on the practical day to day to management of these patients. The provisional program is attached.
