

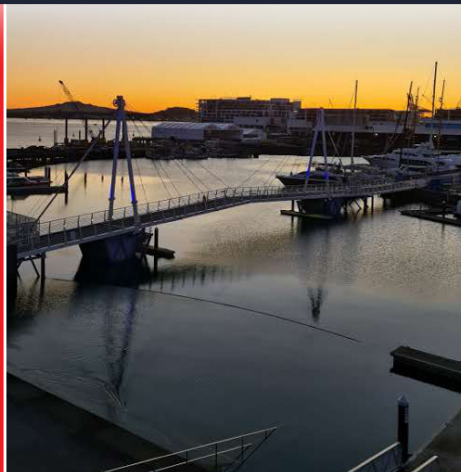

KEYNOTE SPEAKERS



Dr Jean M Connors
MD

- Medical Director, Hemostatic Antithrombotic Stewardship
- Medical Director, Anticoagulation Management Services
- Hematology Division, Brigham and Women's Hospital / Dana-Farber Cancer Institute
- Associate Professor of Medicine, Harvard Medical School

Jean M. Connors, MD is a hematology attending at Brigham and Women's Hospital and Dana Farber Cancer Institute; the Medical Director of the Anticoagulation Management Services, and the Hemostatic Antithrombotic Stewardship Program; and an Associate Professor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School.

She received a medical degree from The Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, completed her residency in internal medicine at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center in Boston, as well as fellowships in transfusion medicine and hematology & oncology from Brigham and Women's Hospital.

Dr. Connors is an Associate Editor for the Journal of Thrombosis and Haemostasis and is a member of or holds a leadership role in many professional societies. She has participated in numerous clinical trials for patients with venous thrombosis and for the use of reversal agents for the direct oral anticoagulants, and is leading trials in the area of mechanical circulatory support and cancer associated thrombosis.



Dr Richard Dillon

Clinical Senior Lecturer in Cancer Genetics, King's College London and Consultant Haematologist, Guy's and St Thomas' NHS Foundation Trust

Dr Richard Dillon is a Clinical Senior Lecturer in Cancer Genetics in the Department of Medical & Molecular Genetics, King's College London and Consultant Haematologist at Guy's Hospital.

Dr Dillon leads the laboratory which evaluates minimal residual disease (MRD) detection using quantitative PCR as a means for directing treatment approach in the context of the UK National Cancer Research Institute (NCRI) leukaemia trials. Dr Dillon has helped to pioneer research into predicting relapse in acute myeloid leukaemia (AML) through development of sensitive molecular methodologies, and is working to establish MRD in AML as a standard of care in the UK.



Professor Beverley J Hunt
MB ChB | FRCP | FRCPPath | MD OB

Beverly Hunt is Professor of Thrombosis & Haemostasis Kings College, Consultant in Thrombosis & Haemophilia Centre (since 1991) & Director of the Vascular Biology and Thrombosis Research unit, GSTT & Clinical Lead in Haematological Sciences ViapathHaematology

She is a recognised national and international expert in thrombosis & bleeding disorders, especially in the management of venous thromboembolism. She has spent years researching & campaigning for improvements in prevention of hospital-associated thrombosis (HAT) and prior to COVID-19 was working with the WHO to improve prevention of HAT globally.

She also has a major research interest in the coagulopathies of viral diseases, particularly the viral haemorrhagic fevers with work going forward on Ebola and was about to start working on a grant from Wellcome on Lassa fever. The outbreak of COVID-19 has seen these interests combine.

She has led internationally in describing the profound thrombotic & haemostatic changes seen in COVID-19 patients and her first major webinar on April 4th for the International Society for Thrombosis & Haemostasis has been viewed 30,000 times. She has subsequently talked at 56 national/international webinars on clots, coagulopathy and COVID-19. She was one of the first to suggest that there are two thrombotic processes in the lungs of those with COVID-19 infection – both hospital-associated thrombosis & also immunothrombosis (thrombosis secondary to the lung inflammation).

Professor Judith Trotman
MBChB | FRACP | FRCPA | Grad Cert
Clin Trials Oncology

Professor Judith Trotman (MBChB, FRACP, FRCPA, Grad Cert Clin Trials Oncology), is a haematologist and Head of Department, Concord Repatriation General Hospital, University of Sydney. As Australasian Leukaemia Lymphoma Group member and past lymphoma group lead she

has contributed to a number of international lymphoma trials collaborations including PRIMA, RATHL, REMARC and RELEVANCE. She provides global leadership in charting the role of PET scanning in follicular lymphoma (PET in PRIMA, FOLLCOLL and GALLIUM studies), and the current PET-Response adapted (PETReA) study. Dr Trotman is committed to embedding research into clinical care as the founding Director, Concord Haematology Clinical Research Unit, and as a Board member of the Australian Clinical Trials Alliance. Judith is also committed to the implementation of research findings into practice, as evidenced by her successful Australian Medicare application for funding of PET for indolent lymphomas. She has developed a number of digital initiatives in collaboration with colleagues and patients, including the first published haematology multidisciplinary team meeting SOP, the ClinTrial Refer smartphone Application, and the WhiMSICAL study - a global patient-derived data base contributed to by several hundred patients with WM. Dr Trotman has published extensively in leading journals including NEJM, Blood, Lancet, Lancet Oncology, Journal of Clinical Oncology and The Lancet Haematology

ABBVIE BREAKFAST SPEAKER



Dr Courtney DiNardo

Dr. Courtney DiNardo is an academic clinical researcher with a primary focus on individualized therapy and precision oncology for myeloid malignancies, including the optimal incorporation of genomics into standard risk assessments and treatment algorithms, and the clinical evaluation of targeted therapeutics for molecularly-defined patient subgroups. Dr. DiNardo has

experience in designing, overseeing, and executing successful clinical trials; from Phase 1 dose-finding studies to innovative investigator-initiated Phase II trials, to confirmatory randomized Phase III trials. Dr. DiNardo has served an integral role in several highly influential trials involving IDH1, IDH2 and BCL2 inhibitors, which have led to the FDA approval of three therapies in AML since 2017 (the first-in-class IDH2 inhibitor enasidenib, the IDH1 inhibitor ivosidenib, and the BCL2 inhibitor venetoclax in combination with hypomethylating agents).

Genetic Predisposition to Haematological Malignancies and Inherited Bone Marrow Failure

DR LUCY FOX

CLINICAL HAEMATOLOGIST | MBBS FRACP FRCPA

Dr Lucy Fox graduated from the University of Melbourne with a double degree in Commerce and Science in 2001 and went on to graduate from Medicine in 2006. Her Haematology Specialist training was completed at the Royal Hobart Hospital, St Vincent's Hospital (Melbourne), Austin Hospital and the Epworth Hospital and she was granted dual Fellowship of the Royal Australasian College of Physicians and the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia in 2017. She is currently undertaking a Molecular Haematology Fellowship at the Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre, and is working towards a higher degree focused on genetic testing in Bone Marrow Failure Syndromes.

8th New Zealand Bone Marrow Pathology Workshop

This year the theme of the Bone marrow workshop is 'Genetic Predisposition to Haematological Malignancies and Inherited Bone Marrow Failure Disorders'.

The discussion will revolve around cases submitted in advance by the participants. The workshop will explore various clinical and laboratory aspects of these conditions, approach to patient evaluation and diagnostic work-up including genomic testing.

It will be led by Dr Lucy Fox from Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre in Melbourne, an expert in genetic testing in Bone Marrow Failure Syndromes. It is suitable for both clinical and laboratory based haematologists and haematology trainees as well as for researchers and laboratory scientists involved in this field.
